### 2020/2021: A year unlike any other.

During the 2020-2021 school year, all Cooking with Kids programming in schools was delivered virtually. Even in virtual school settings, Cooking with Kids programs continued to provide fun and positive experiences with healthy foods, bring academic subjects to life, and support healthy eating at home. Here's how we adapted to the virtual world:

#### Virtual Food Literacy Classes

During the regular online school day, students participated in a series of Cooking with Kids digital classroom lessons. Conducted by the school's Cooking with Kids educator, these lessons centered around key concepts of food literacy.

#### Online Family Cooking Nights

Cooking with Kids partnered with all participating schools to host these events, which engaged the entire family and provided a safe way for kids to explore and prepare new, healthy foods in their own kitchens.

#### Family Cooking Kits

Cooking with Kids was able to offer free ingredient kits to families who needed assistance in order to participate in the family cooking nights.

### What is Food Literacy?

Food literacy encompasses a wide range of food-related concepts and has a direct impact on food access, which is a complex, multi-layered issue. Food literacy includes knowing where our food comes from, understanding the nutritional and health impact of what we eat, identifying the social and emotional connections we have with food, and acquiring confidence in the foods we choose, prepare, and eat.

> What happens in a virtual food literacy class with elementary students?

LOTS of things! This year, our students read stories, drew pictures of colorful foods and farms, did scavenger hunts, completed a recipe-writing challenge, took virtual farm field trips, practiced their map skills, journeyed the Silk Road. learned about food celebrations around the world. shared stories about food traditions, planted seeds, and played Jeopardy!

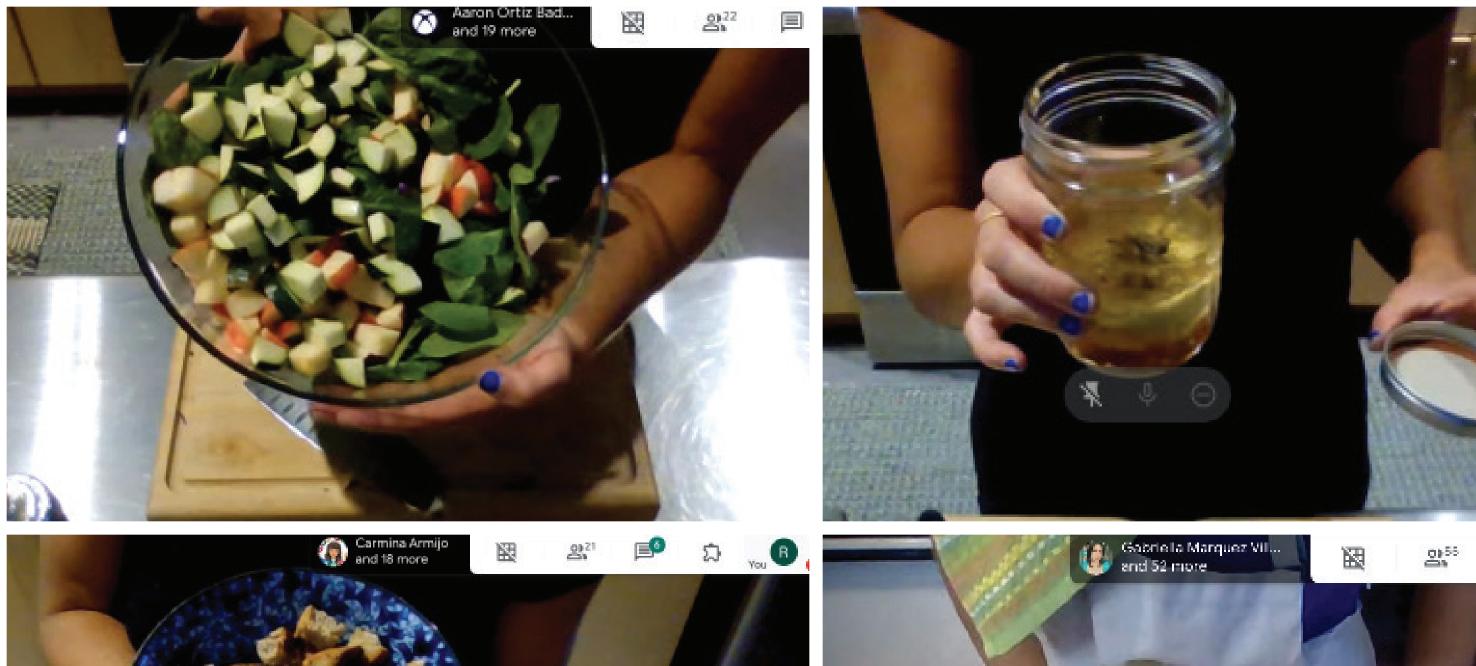

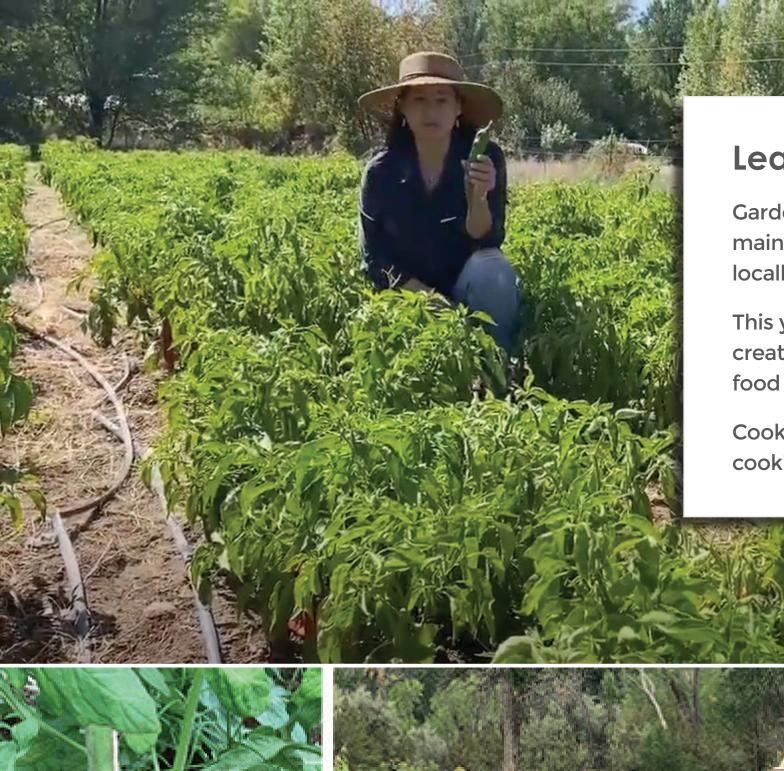

### **Learning About How Food Grows**

Gardening education is a part of Cooking with Kids. We help build and maintain school gardens, and our programs connect kids with farmers and locally grown produce from Northern New Mexico.

### **Exciting Extras and Partnerships**

- Over the past year, educators and families from 48 states, Puerto Rico, and Canada have downloaded resources from cookingwithkids.org, including fruit & vegetables tasting lessons and downloadable cooking lessons.
- Community cooking classes: Presbyterian Healthcare Services and Cooking with Kids continued their partnership this year, providing free online cooking classes for families.
